In particular, many of these sailor tattoos emerged from Japan, China, and many of the Pacific Islands.

Fast forward to the first half of the 20th century when there were not one, but two world wars. Young men around the world were being sent to battle, some of them not returning. This caused a tremendous rise in tattoos, especially amongst American men who were using tattoos to signify the battles they fought in and other tribulations along the way.

What Are American Traditional Tattoos?

Artists began to pop up in America and develop their own styles. At the forefront of this was a former Navy man named Norman Collins, affectionately called Sailor Jerry. Sailor Jerry was heavily tattooed, learned his craft from Japanese tattoo masters, and with the United States being thrust into war against the Japanese after Pearl Harbor, promised to "beat them at their own game" employing their techniques alongside his own creativity and American patriotism.
